LYNN KATZ, PETFINDER, COM

Lynn is a member of the shelter outreach team at Petfinder.com and manages the Adoption Options program. She has been involved in shelter and rescue work for over a decade and has served as manager of the state of New Jersey's pilot low-cost spay/neuter clinic. She is a certified ACO in the state of New Jersey and a former board member of a local TNR program. Lynn lives in New Jersey with her household of special needs pets.

SEAN HAWKINS, SAVING ANIMALS ACROSS BORDERS

Sean has worked professionally in the field of animal care and protection since 1985. At the behest of Cleveland Armory and the Fund for Animals, Sean opened the "largest spay & neuter clinic in the world" in Manhattan, and additional clinics in Houston, Dallas, San Antonio and Albuquerque. The Fund's clinics became an independent charity known as the Spay-Neuter Assistance Program (SNAP) in 1999, with Sean at its helm. SNAP grew to operate 10 facilities in the United States and Mexico. Sean is president of Saving Animals Across Borders, which operates six highvolume, high quality sterilization and wellness clinics in the United States and Mexico. Sean is also an independent consultant for PetSmart Charities, Inc.

GRANT GUGISBERG, DVM, CARVER LAKE VET CENTER

Dr. Gugisberg is a 1991 graduate of the University of Minnesota. Licensed in five states, he practices at Carver Lake Veterinary Center in Woodbury, Minnesota. As part of his practice he operates a referral cat behavior service, doing both in-clinic and in-home consultations. He has participated in national roundtable discussions regarding feline upper respiratory tract infections. He is a member of the AVMA and the MVMA, is a past member of the St. Croix Animal Shelter Animal Care Committee, and has received fellow status with the American Association of Feline Practitioners.

DESIREE BENDER, WHERE ANGELS RUN

Desiree is the founder/president of Where Angels Run, a pit bull welfare organization in Arkansas, and program coordinator for the Humane Society of Faulkner County. She is a former long-time Pit Bull Rescue Central volunteer, a certified cruelty investigator, an HSUS DART volunteer and an expert witness in five cases involving pit bulls and has sat on numerous municipal committees drafting dangerous dog ordinances. She works with shelters throughout the nation in developing pit bull specific adoption, spay/neuter and outreach/education programs. She has more than 12 years of experience rescuing, handling, evaluating and housing pit bulls and has developed outreach programs that target pit bull owners and an education program with the Arkansas Juvenile Detention System involving her rescued fighting dog, Bubba.
